

Monday	Objective: Learn color pencil techniques and apply them to their drawing inspired by their design made from junk food packaging
	Activities: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Finish constructing their junk food packaging collage. • Make either 2” square or a 4” square viewfinder on scrap paper. Divide all sides into 8 sections(1/4” for the 2” square, 1/2: for the 4” square) and mark the vertical sections in numbers 1-8 and the horizontal sections into letters A-H. • Use the view finder on their collage to find their design for enlarging. Discuss this with their teacher, and then tape it down on their collage.
	Materials: 9”x 9” paper, rulers, scissors, glue sticks. Past students’ examples of their junk food designs
Tuesday	Objective: Objective: Learn color pencil techniques and apply them to their drawing inspired by their design made from junk food packaging
	Activities: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On 12”square white paper, use pencil to grid it into 8 equal sections (1 ½ “). • Enlarge their design contained in their viewfinder to their 12” square paper using the grid technique. Draw lightly in pencil. • When they are through with enlarging their design, erase all grid lines.
	Materials: Pencil, erasers, 12” square white paper, rulers
Wednesday & Thursday	Objective: Objective: Learn color pencil techniques and apply them to their drawing inspired by their design made from junk food packaging
	Activities: Start to add color pencils to their drawings. Look carefully at the colors on their collage and work out the color mixtures on scrap paper before adding them to their collage. Capture all the highlights and shadows where they appear in the collage. To complete this drawing using colored pencils of their food packaging collage will take aprox. 2 weeks.
	Materials: Pencil, erasers, 12” square white paper, rulers, Prisma color pencils.
Friday	Objective: Objective: Learn color pencil techniques and apply them to their drawing inspired by their design made from junk food packaging
	Activities: Continue to add prisma color pencils to their design using colored pencil techniques. See Thursdays activity.
	Materials: Pencil, erasers, 12” square white paper, Prisma color pencils
