Class: Art 2 Drawing

Monday	Objective: TLW : formulate visual solutions to express personal themes in a mixed media project
	Activities: Introduce the Never Dull & Glue Line Drawing that has a Social or Political content. Show past students examples. Tell them to start with a social statement that is important to them. Apply magazines to the background of their paper. These can contain images of your statement but know ahead of time that they will be faded out or wiped out with only remnants left. Brighter colors work best.
	Materials: Magazines, glue, background paper, Never Dull, Handouts
Tuesday	Objective: TLW formulate visual solutions to express personal themes in a mixed media project
	Activities: Continue the Never Dull & Glue Line Drawing that has a Social or Political content that was started on Monday. This part takes time to find images that will work well with their ideas.
	Materials: Magazines, glue, background paper, Never Dull, Handouts, Past students examples.
Wednesday & Thursday	Objective: TLW Select and Critique personal artworks for presentation
	Activities: The class will take time out from the Never Dull & Glue Line Drawing to mat their self portraits in eight techniques and styles that have been now been graded. The students will get back all of their drawings and select works for a final presentation, evaluating their projects and selecting their best for their composite art work. Students will then spray glue their choices onto black paper for a final presentation of their best self-portraits.
	Materials: Scissors, Cutting Board, Mat Knives, Cutting Boards, Spray Glue, Black Matt Boards or Black Construction Paper.
Friday	Objective: TLW formulate visual solutions to express personal themes in a mixed media project.
	Activities: Continue their Never Dull & Glue Line Drawing assignment. When the background is finished, draw a figure or object that pertains to your statement with glue. It can be literal, but sometimes subtle, symbolic or metaphorical images are more intriguing. Let the glue dry before going on to the next part
	Materials: Magazines, glue, background paper, Never Dull
