Monday	Objective: Introduce students to basic Watercolor Techniques to be used in future watercolor art works
	Activities: Teacher demonstrates Flat Wash & Graded Wash watercolor techniques. Students then practice these techniques. Students have the opportunity to try them a couple of times to get the technique correct.  Painting a simple shape in a flat and graded wash can be an enrichment exercise for those who get it right away.
	Materials: Watercolor palettes with 10 colors, empty palettes & small cups for mixing washes, brushes, water containers, watercolor paper.
Tuesday	Objective: Introduce students to basic Watercolor Techniques to be used in future watercolor art works
	Activities: Teacher demonstrates Transitional Wash watercolor technique and then shows students how this technique can be used for more involved paintings. Students then practice this technique. Students have the opportunity to try them a couple of times to get the technique correct.
	Materials: Watercolor palettes with 10 colors, empty palettes & small cups for mixing washes, brushes, water containers, watercolor paper.
Wednesday & Thursday	Objective: Introduce students to basic Watercolor Techniques to be used in future watercolor art works
	Activities: Teacher demonstrates Wet in Wet watercolor technique and then shows students how this technique can be used as background for more involved paintings. Students then practice this technique on three or four papers. Students need to have these finished today so they can go into them with other techniques tomorrow.  Teacher demonstrates Dry Brush and Edge Shading watercolor techniques and then shows them how these can be used in more complex paintings and how they can be applied on top of their wet in wet paintings to develop them further.
	Materials: Watercolor palettes with 10 colors, empty palettes & small cups for mixing washes, brushes, water containers, watercolor paper.
Friday	Objective: Introduce students to basic Watercolor Techniques to be used in future watercolor art works
	Activities: Teacher demonstrates how to apply the Dry Brush, Edge Shading, and Overlaying Washes to their wet in wet watercolors made yesterday to produce watercolor landscapes.
	Materials: Watercolor palettes with 10 colors, empty palettes & small cups for mixing washes, brushes, water containers, watercolor paper.
